Project Background

The objective of Safer Stronger Communities Fund (SSCF) is to improve the quality of life for people living in Cliftonville West and Margate Central wards, realised through a multi-agency, co-ordinated approach to understanding the priorities and needs of local people, forming the basis for future service provision.

SSCF commissioned Sustainability Actions (SA), a local voluntary organisation, to undertake a mapping exercise to identify the Voluntary and Community Sector Organisations that provide services to, or engage with, the residents of the Cliftonville West and Margate Central wards. In addition SSCF wanted to ascertain the nature of their work, and produce an analysis of the findings, along with an insight into the groups who, given funding would extend their sphere of activity to these two wards.

Project Aims

The SSCF Programme needs to know who is doing what in the Community and Voluntary Sector so they can:

- Understand the priorities and needs of local people.
- Identify which services and facilities are already available for the residents of the designated wards.
- Identify the gaps in provision where needs are not being met.
- Work in partnership with the Voluntary and community sector to develop services to meet these needs.
- Use the findings to inform future funding policy and make grants where they will be most effective.

Questionnaire Design

Based on the project brief, SA developed a draft questionnaire which was then refined through a collaborative review process to reflect SSCF's key priorities:

- The questionnaire was devised with reference to guidelines produced by the Community Development Foundation on "Mapping the Voluntary and Community Sector".
- Consideration was given to factors affecting response, and considerable effort was made not to systematically exclude any types of groups due to the survey method. For example, we are aware that organisations working with victims of domestic violence are reluctant to give a postal address, so we asked the Domestic Violence Forum to forward the questionnaire on our behalf.

Timescale

The mapping exercise timescale was:

- Commence 1st February 2007
- Conclude on 29th March 2007



Data Source

In the absence of a comprehensive, up to date information source for community and voluntary sector activity in Margate and Cliftonville, SA identified and collated a number of disparate information sources to compile one central database of over 1000 contacts for individuals active in the community and voluntary sector in Thanet.

These were then screened to ensure that they met the scope and brief set out by the SSCF bid, producing a tailored database of 400 organisations.

Project Methodology

SA employed a robust, multi-tiered contact strategy to ensure that the questionnaire was received, completed and returned by as many relevant organisations as possible:

- A postal version of the questionnaire was sent, together with an explanatory covering letter and a postage-prepaid envelope, to just under 300 contacts.
- A further 120 email questionnaires were sent out.
- Churches, schools, forums, health workers and community groups were contacted by phone in an effort to reach groups not on the original database.
- Where contact details were found to be out of date or inaccurate, they were up-dated through telephone and internet research.
- On the closing date a further e-mail version was sent out to all groups/organisations that had not responded.
- Further postal and electronic versions were sent out over the course of the project as contacts were identified.
- Telephone support was provided to the groups, four days a week, eight hours a day, the lines remaining open until 7pm. Questionnaires were followed up by phone and e-mail.
- In total 743 phone calls were made on behalf of the mapping project, and at all times the SSCF grant scheme was actively promoted.
- A total of 400 + questionnaires were sent out and 112 completed questionnaires were returned.

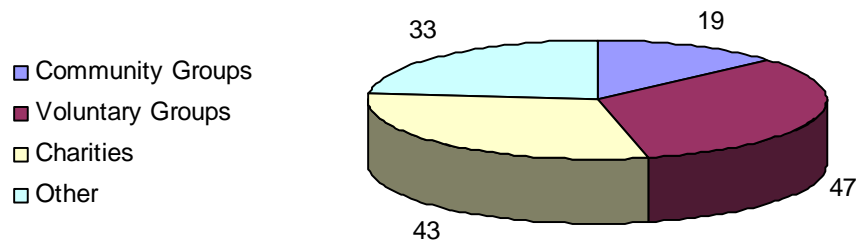


The Questionnaire

2.1 Please tell us what type of group/organisation you are.

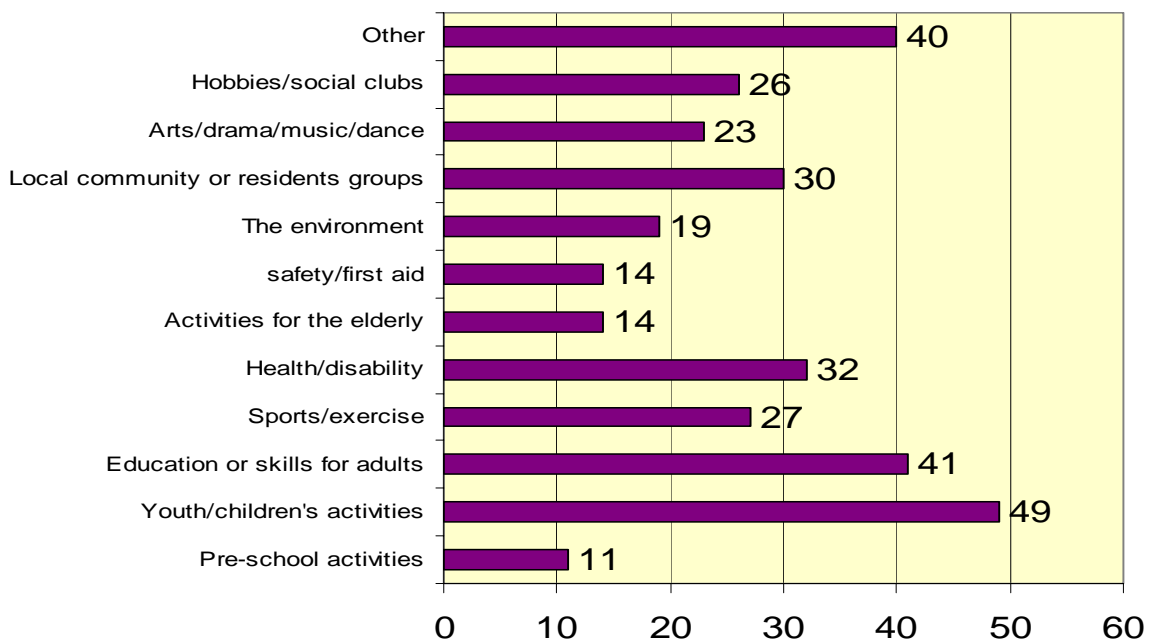


The above chart shows the number of groups selecting each option. Many groups selected two or three options. For types of group/organisation listed as 'Other' see **Appendix 1**

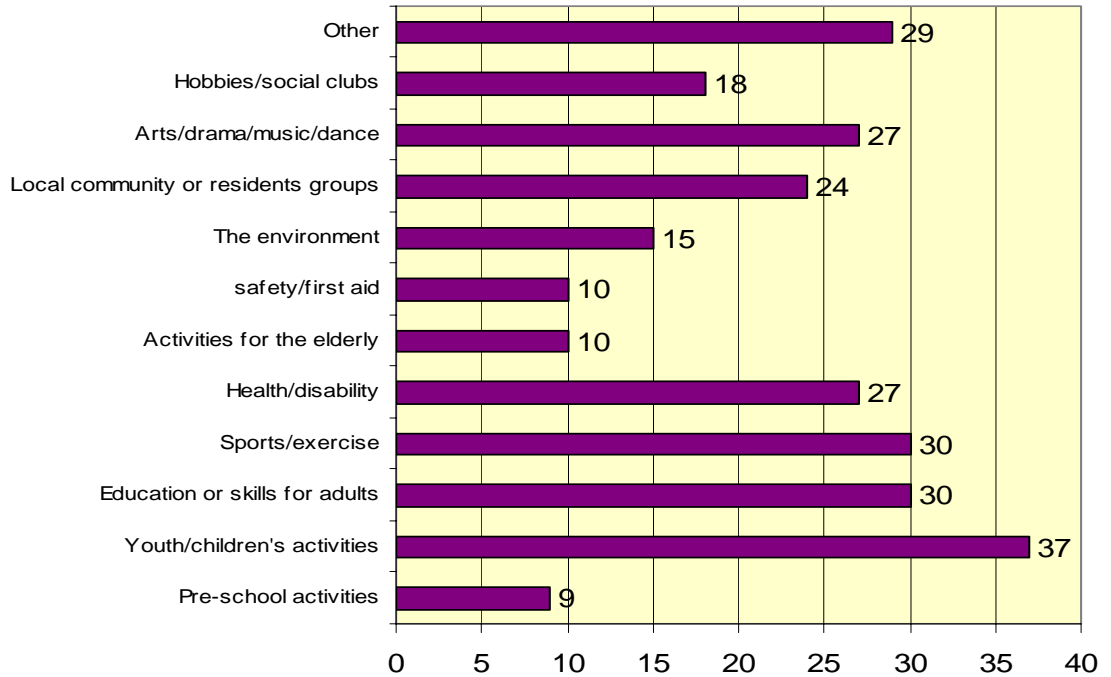
2.2 What are the main aims of your group/organisation?

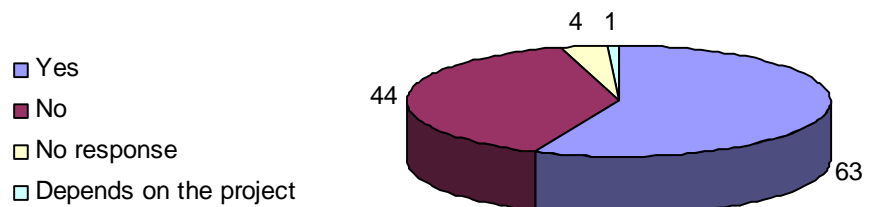

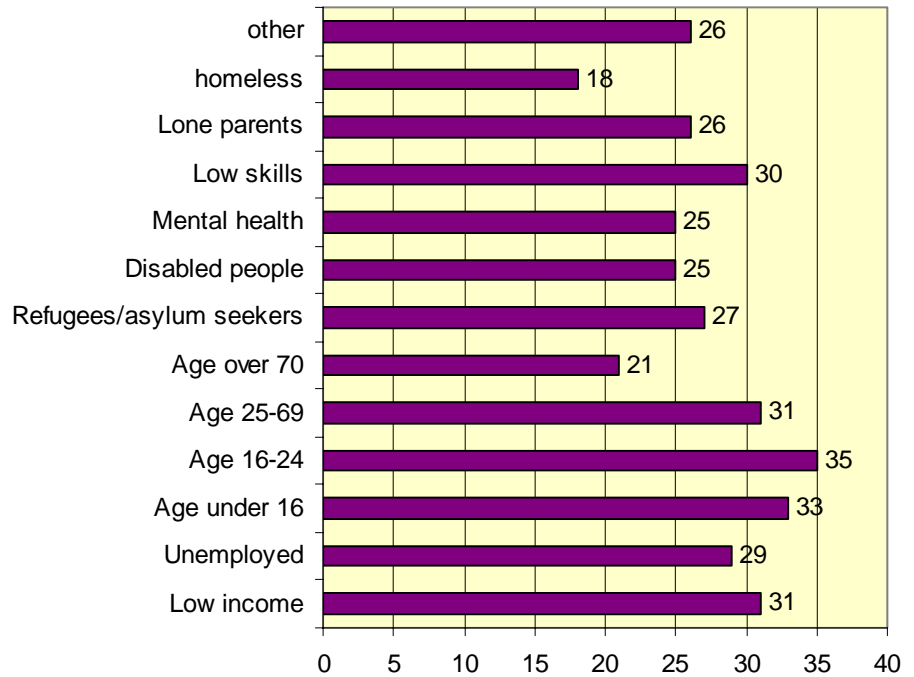

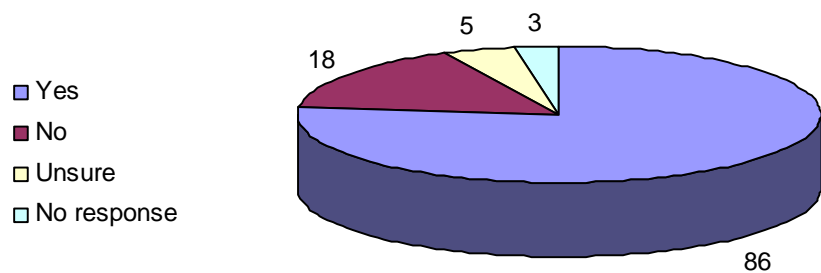

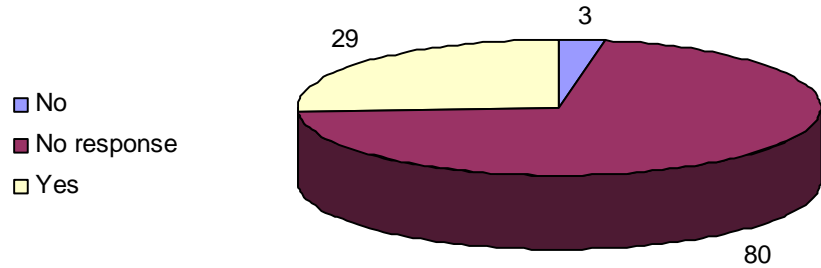


2.10a If 'Yes', how many?

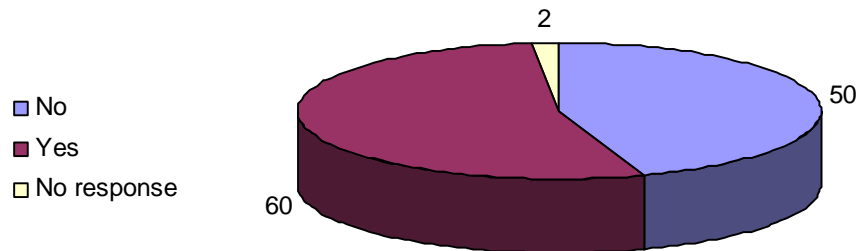

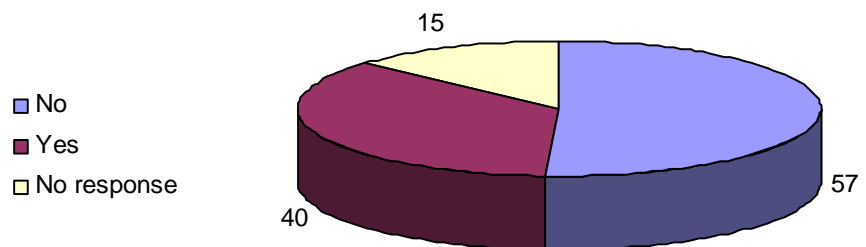

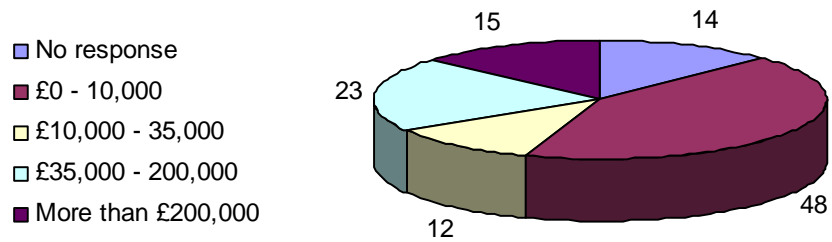

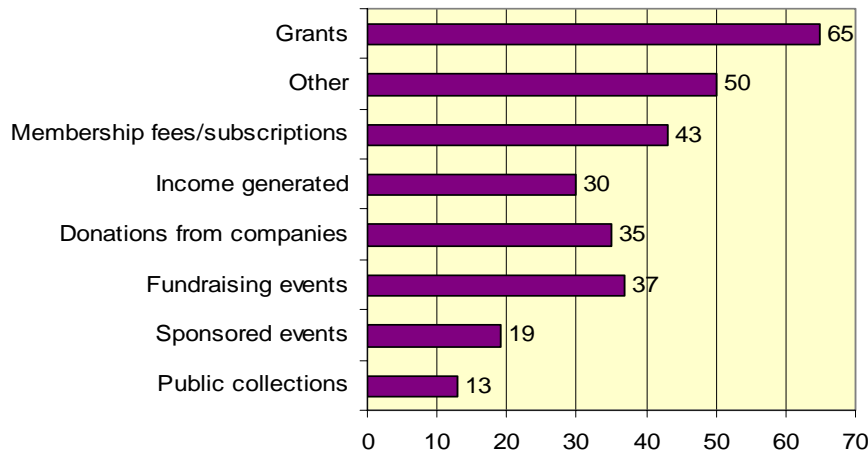

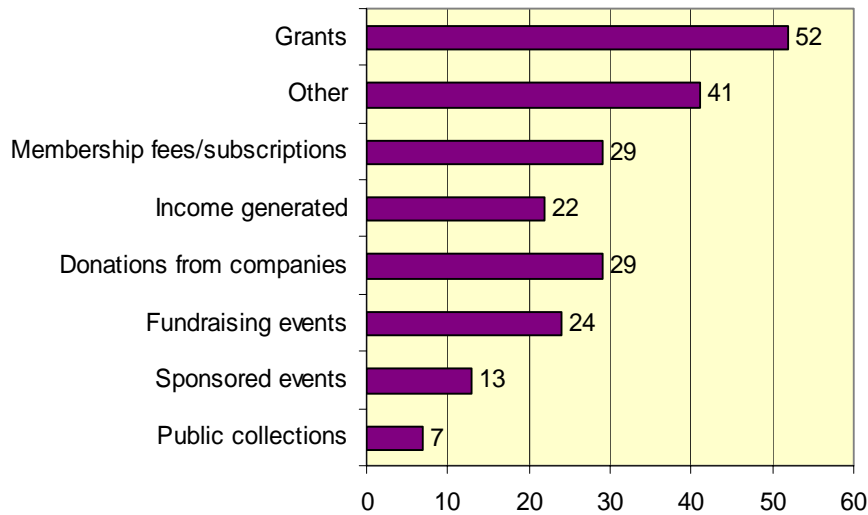

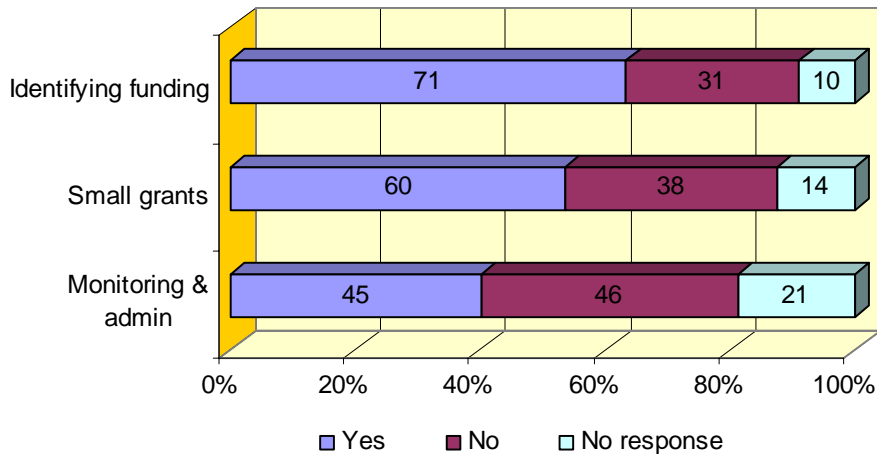
4.3b (Funding of groups/organisations active in Margate Central and Cliftonville West)



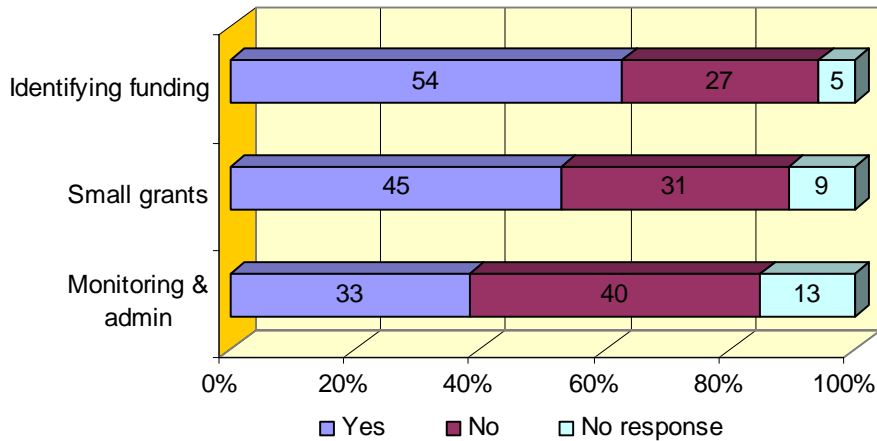

Breakthrough/Breakthrough Plus takes a holistic approach to support provision and will refer to and work closely with other agencies to meet the varying needs of individual families. We have very close links with schools in Thanet and have one designated key worker who works within secondary schools as part of the Take Time to Talk team.

The Thanet Community Safety Survey found that anti-social behaviour is as much a concern to young people as it is to older members. The Engaging Youth Group will be a working partnership between voluntary and official agencies within the Thanet area. AIM The aim of the meeting is to ensure that youths are neither victims nor perpetrators of anti-social behaviour. Terms of Reference Linking all youth agencies to develop a Youth Policy and Strategy for Thanet in order to raise awareness of youth issues and to ensure that needs are met in the appropriate way by the appropriate agencies. To develop Youth Consultancy forums in order promote positive images of young people and including youths in Local Management Boards. To fill gaps in provisions and to provide outreach services to assist hard to reach groups in order to ensure that all youth groups are included. To also ensure that events are properly advertised and co-ordinated to youths and agencies. We run the Parentalk parenting principles course. We provide the Super Nanny intensive family support programme (1 month intensive parenting intervention). We run a Parents support group and we have case load of a number of families who need on-going befriending, advocacy and support. 3. We are aiming to run a needs-led family centre for the deprived Whitehall estate in Ramsgate (where the centre is based). We run a pre-school, a 'Mums and Tots', an after school club for Infant school aged children, we have a full-time youth worker running various groups and one-2-one support. We run various seasonal and holiday activities. We also provide ongoing and flexible support for the most vulnerable families on the estate.

Focus to Work

Focus to Work has played a pivotal role in the development of Social Enterprise in Kent and the South East. We believe it is our responsibility to enable new and existing social enterprises to develop and prosper. In order to achieve this aim we are partners in a number of projects that seek to improve the support structures, systems and infrastructures of social enterprises in order to facilitate growth of the sector.



Gordon Road Street Scheme (GRASS)	We organise the Cliftonville Olympics, bi annual street clean initiatives to reduce fly tipping by enabling the residents to get rid of unwanted items. We monitor and report: fly tipping, street lights, anti social activity by neighbours and in the streets. We produce and distribute a 500 copy 1/4ly newsletter, GRASS ROOTS. We also provide vehicles for local community groups, clubs and Charities to assist them to go out and about at very affordable rates.
Thanet District Citizens Advice Bureau	Free legal advice and information to anyone who lives or works in Thanet.
Thanet Fairtrade Initiative	A Campaigning Group. We hold events, run workshops, give talks etc. about the plight of producers in the developing world, and encourage consumers – businesses, places of study, places of worship, shops, restaurants, hotels, B&Bs etc. to sell, serve or use Fairtrade products and local produce, and to support our campaign to make and keep Thanet a Fairtrade Island.



Thanet GAP Project	Crèche, parents & toddlers group, youth clubs, lunch club for young people out of work and school, after-school activities, football competitions and a theatre group and various young peoples workshops i.e. break-dancing. Coffee mornings, sit & be fit and lunch club for the elderly. IT courses and one to one tuition and learn direct courses and free internet access. Keep fit and the WEB group; for people with learning difficulties.
Thanet Heart Support Group	We meet once a month when there is a speaker, a chance for a cup of tea/coffee and a chat with other people; a raffle; sales table; heart related books available; a health worker to take blood pressures for those who want it. Transport is made available for those unable to get to the meeting on their own. We also arrange outings occasionally and help those who need it to get to rehabilitation classes.
Thanet Indoor Bowls Club	Provide indoor bowls facility of 8 rinks for members and general public 7 days per week. Also provide restaurant and bar facility for members and general public.
Thanet Mediation Service	We offer mediation to anybody living or working in Thanet who is in conflict or dispute with another/others. We also train school children and adults in the mediation process.

A wide area of opportunity (residential, tenanted, education, employment, day services) for people with learning disabilities and respite for families. We do this in Thanet by working with local landlords and estate agents to find suitable accommodation for our clients. Our Rough Sleepers Service is open from 8 – 9pm every night and hands out food, clothes and blankets to people who are sleeping rough in the area.

We can support people individually to make their person centred plan and learn the skills they have identified. We provide training and research for other organisations led by learning disabled people with support if necessary.

We provide victims of crime the opportunity to talk about their experience to trained volunteers, who listen and offer options on how to cope with the effects of the crime.
