

THE THANET DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2022

The Thanet District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 32, 34, 35, 39(3) and 124 and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and with the consent of the Kent County Council given under section 39 of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

PART 1

GENERAL

CITATION, COMENCEMENT and REVOCATIONS

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April 2022 and may be cited as "THANET DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2022" ('this Order').
2. The "THANET DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2020" ('the Order') as varied is revoked in its entirety.

Interpretation

3. In this Order:-

Term	Meaning
"the Council"	means the Thanet District Council;
"the TMA 2004"	means the Traffic Management Act 2004, or any subsequent amendment thereto;
"Authorised Person"	means a Civil Enforcement Officer or other person duly authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform;
"Administration Fee"	means a fee charged as set in Schedule 3 for the transfer, loss, destruction and replacement of any Permit;
"Barrier Controlled Car Park"	means a Parking Place whereby access into and out of the place is controlled by Entry and Exit Barrier System and linked to Pay Stations or another payment system;
"Builders Skip"	means a container or whatever shape or method of manufacture designed and used or intended for the collection and short-term storage of building materials, domestic or office furniture and fittings, discarded domestic or office appliances, rubble and waste;
"Bus" and "Buses"	have the same meaning as in Regulation 22(2) of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (and subsequent appropriate legislation), and "bus" shall be construed accordingly;
"Caravan"	means any structure designed or adapted for human habitation which is capable of being moved from one place to another (whether by being towed or by being transported on a motor vehicle or trailer)
"Civil Enforcement Area"	means an area where civil enforcement of parking restrictions can be undertaken as defined by s.74 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;
"Civil Enforcement Officer"	means a person employed by the Council in pursuance of powers granted by s.76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;
"Chargeable hours"	means the times specified in an item in column 5 of Schedule 2 appropriate to the Parking Place named in column 1 of that Schedule;
"Charge Certificate"	means a certificate issued by the Council stating that payment has not been received or an appeal or a representation lodged following the issue of a Penalty Charge;
"Coach"	means a passenger carrying Vehicle, exceeding 5.5m in length and capable of carrying more than 16 people;

Term	Meaning
"Commercial Vehicle"	means any mechanically propelled Vehicle which is constructed or adapted for the carriage of goods;
"Contravention"	means a failure to comply with restrictions set out in this Order that may result in the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice;
"Delivering" and "Collecting"	in relation to any Goods includes checking the Goods for the purposes of delivery or collection;
"Disabled Parking Bay"	means a bay within a Parking Place identified by surface markings and/or other signage, for the parking at any time of vehicles displaying valid persons badge;
"Disabled Person's Badge"	has the same meaning as in regulation s.2 of the Disabled Person's (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;
"Disabled Person's Vehicle"	means a vehicle lawfully displaying a Disabled Person's Badge and which is a vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 to be included in an Order under the Act, has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case may be, has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers;
"Double Yellow Lines"	means a road marking of the size, colour and type shown in diagram 1018.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 which has been placed in a car park to indicate that the waiting of vehicles in that part of the car park , or on a side length of access road or any other road forming part of the car park, is prohibited at any time;
"Driver"	in relation to a Vehicle waiting in a Parking Place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the Parking Place;
"Electric Charging Point"	means the equipment that is used to charge an Electric Vehicle;
"Electrically Propelled Vehicle" or " Electric Vehicle"	means a Vehicle in which the electrical motive power is derived from any electrical storage battery which is not connected to any source of power when the Vehicle is in motion;
"Emergency Services Vehicle"	means a Vehicle operated by the police, fire & rescue service or ambulance service;
"Entry Barrier System"	means the equipment located at the entrance to car parks to control access by the issue of Parking Tickets or other payment systems;
"Exit Barrier System"	means the equipment located at the exit to car parks to control ,egress activated by the issue of Parking Tickets or by other payment systems;
"Goods"	includes postal packets of any description and has the same meaning as that assigned to postal packets in s.27 of the Postal Services Act 2011;
"Goods Vehicle"	means a vehicle which is designed and constructed for the primary purpose of carrying Goods;
"Hand-Held Device"	means a piece of computing equipment that can be used in the hand, such as a smartphone or tablet computer used for parking enforcement and to view electronic records;
"Heavy Goods Vehicle"	has the same meaning as "heavy commercial vehicle" as defined in the 1988 Act Section 20, that is to say any goods vehicle which has an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes;
"Heavy Motor Car"	means a Vehicle as defined in Section 136(3) of the Act;
"Hoteliers Voucher"	means a Permit issued by the Council to a Hotel for parking requirements of their resident visitors to be able to park within a selected Parking Place as identified in Schedule 3 of this Order;
"Hybrid Electrically Propelled Vehicle" or "Hybrid Vehicles"	means a Vehicle primarily powered by an electrical storage battery;

Term	Meaning
"Linear Tariff"	means a system of parking payment with a set minimum and maximum payment allowing parking to be paid for by payment of any amount between the minimum and maximum values;
"Light Commercial Vehicle"	means any motor vehicle designed or adapted as a van, pickup truck or utility vehicle for the carriage of goods which has a design gross weight not exceeding 3500 kilograms;
"Long Stay"	means a Parking Place allows a maximum of 24 hours parking, unless otherwise stated in Schedule 1 and 2, when the appropriate fee is paid;
"Marked Bay"	has the same meaning as Parking Bay;
"Minibus"	means a small passenger carrying motor vehicle not exceeding 5.5m in length capable of carrying more than 8 but not more than 16 passengers whether or not the same is either a motor car or a heavy motor car as the case may be;
"Motor car"	means any Motor Car within the meaning of s.136(2) of the Act with the exception of a Commercial Vehicle;
"Motor Caravan"	means a motor vehicle not exceeding 5.5m in length which provides fixed sleeping arrangements whether or not the same is wither a Motor Car or a Heavy Motor Car as the case may be;
"Motor-cycle"	has the same meaning as in s.136 of the Act and includes any motor vehicle with less than 4 wheels;
"Motor-cycle Bay"	means a Parking Bay marked out on the surface of the Parking Place, or indicated by sign(s), that is reserved for the parking of solo Motorcycles only;
"Notice to Owner"	means a statutory notice served by the Council on the person they believe is the owner of a Vehicle against whom they have issued a Penalty Charge Notice that remains unpaid after 28 days;
"Owner" (in relation to a vehicle)	means the person by whom such Vehicle is kept and used;
"Parent and Child Parking Bay"	means a Parking Bay providing additional space around a parked car provided for use by parents accompanied by small children or heavily pregnant mother to be;
"Parking Adjudicator"	has the same meaning as in s.81 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;
"Parking Authority"	means in relation to a Parking Place which was provided or authorised under s.32(1) of the Act, the Thanet District Council;
"Parking Bay"	means any part of a Parking Place which is provided for the leaving of a Vehicle and indicated by markings or different coloured blocks where the surface is block-paved, for the leaving of a Vehicle;
"Parking Disc"	means a Permit, issued by a local authority, 125mm in diameter and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;
"Parking Charge"	means the charge specified in respect of a Parking Place in column 7 of Schedule 2;
"Parking Place"	means any area of land provided by the Council under s.32(1) of the Act, for use as a parking place and specified by situation and named in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order;
"Parking Session"	means leaving a Vehicle in a Parking Place for a period of time as in Schedule 1 and 2 to this Order;
"Parking Space"	means a space in a Parking Place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;
"Parking Ticket"	means a ticket relating to a Parking Place issued by a ticket machine or a parking attendant;
"Pay and Display Ticket"	means a system of payment used at Parking Places operated by the Council for the parking of Vehicles where prepaid tickets must be obtained from a Ticket Machine and displayed in the relevant position within the Vehicle bearing for which it has been issued; or an appropriate payment has been made by the Council's "Pay by Phone" system;

Term	Meaning
"Pay and Display Machine"	means a Pay and Display ticket issuing machine operated by the Council;
"Pay and Display Ticket"	means a prepaid ticket issued from the Council's operated Pay & Display Machine within a Parking Place in which the Vehicle is parked, obtained for the purpose of showing proof of payment to park (according to the published traffics of charges) for parking, showing the following information: (i) the time of purchase (ii) the amount paid (iii) the date of purchase (iv) the time of expiry (v) name of the Parking Place and, (vi) the ticket machine reference number
"Pay by Phone"	means a method of payment whereby the charge levied under the Council's published tariff of charges (and any appropriate administration charge) is collected by a Council's appointed third party, via an arranged account, with payment being made over the telephone or by other electronic system (including via the internet) by credit or debit card or other means of secure authorised payment. This method requires contact with the Council appointed third party immediately upon parking to register the act of parking;
"Pay Station"	means the equipment installed at a barrier-controlled Parking Place to enable payment of the appropriate fee to be made;
"Penalty Charge"	means a charge of the appropriate higher or lower level rates, set in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 2004 payable to the Council in the event of any contravention of this order;
"Penalty Charge Notice"	means a notice indicating a Penalty Charge has been incurred served by either attaching it to the Vehicle or by first class post to the DVLA Registered Keeper of the motor Vehicle observed in Contravention of the regulations made by this Order;
"Permit"	means a Temporary Parking Permit, Season Ticket, Hoteliers Voucher, Virtual Voucher or Virtual Permit issued by the Council to an individual to park a Vehicle in the Parking Bay and valid for one or more than one Parking Session; improper use of which will render the permit void;
"Registered Keeper"	in relation to a vehicle, means the person whose name the Vehicle is registered under the Act of 1994;
"Release Fee"	means a charge a set in Schedule 3 to release a Vehicle from any Parking Place out of hours when attended by the standby service;
"Relevant Date"	means the date upon which any Vehicle is or was parked in any Parking Place referred to in this Order or upon which any event occurs or occurred in breach of any of the provisions of this Order or to which this Order relates;
"Relevant Position" (in the case of a Disabled Person's Badge)	means:- 1) in respect of a Disabled Person's Badge and where the Vehicle is fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from the outside of the Vehicle; or 2) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the Disabled Person's Badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from the outside of the Vehicle;

Term	Meaning
"Relevant Position" (in the case of a Permit)	means:- 1) in respect of a Permit and where the Vehicle is fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the ticket is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from the outside the Vehicle; or 2) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted, the Permit is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside of the Vehicle;
"Reserved Parking Bay"	means a Parking Bay marked with alpha or number markings and issued to an individual to park a Vehicle in the Parking Bay identified in the Schedule 1 and 2;
"Season Ticket"	means a Permit or Virtual Parking Permit issued by the Council to an individual to park a Vehicle in the Parking Bay and valid for more than one Parking Session; improper use of which will render the permit void;
"Short Stay"	means a Parking Place allows a maximum of 4 hours parking, unless otherwise stated in column 6 of Schedule 2, when the appropriate fee is paid;
"Sign"	means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised by the Council;
"Skip"	means a builder's skip;
"Temporary Parking Permit"	means a Permit issued by the Council for parking requirements of guests or visitors to the Council or those given special authorisation by it; improper use of which will render the permit void;
"Trailer"	means a trailer as defined in s.136(1) of the Act;
"Ticket Machine"	means apparatus of a type and design approved either generally or specially by the Secretary of State for the purpose of the Parking Place, being apparatus designed to indicate the time and to issue Parking Tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the period in respect of which it has been paid and machine number;
"Universal Service Provider"	has the same meaning as in s.65 of the Postal Services Act 2011;
"Valid Pay & Display Ticket"	means a ticket issued from a Ticket Machine within a Pay & Display car park, that shows the time the ticket was purchased, expiry date and time, the fee paid and the machine number, such tickets to be non-transferable to another car or used in another car park;
"Vehicle"	has the same meaning as that assigned to "motor vehicle" in s.136(1) of the Act;
"Virtual Permit"	means a Season Ticket issued by the Council to an individual to park a Vehicle in the Parking Bay and valid for more than one Parking Session; improper use of which will render the permit void;
"Visitors Voucher"	means a Permit issued by the Council for parking requirements of residents or household residing in the district for their visitors to be able to park within a selected Parking Place as identified in Schedule 3 of this Order;

4. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires:-

- (a) any reference to a numbered Article or a numbered Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order;
- (b) any reference to a numbered or lettered paragraph or sub-paragraph is a reference to the paragraph or sub-paragraph bearing that number or letter in the Article or Schedule or (in the case of a sub-paragraph) paragraph in which the reference occurs; and
- (c) any reference to a Table, or to a numbered Table, is a reference to the Table, or to the Table bearing that number, in the Article or Schedule in which that reference occurs.

5. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment;
6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made under or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment;
7. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
8. (1) Each area of land specified by name in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for such classes of vehicles, in such positions, and on such days and during such hours and for such vehicles displaying a Permit issued by the Council as are specified in relation to that area in the said Schedule.

(2) Each area of land specified by name in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for such classes of Vehicles, in such positions, and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that area in the said Schedule.
9. Each area of land specified by name in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for such classes of Vehicle, in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that area in the said Schedule.
10. The Driver of a Vehicle shall not, except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council, permit that Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place except during the days and hours of operation specified in the Schedules to this Order in relation to that Parking Place.
11. Where in the Schedules to this Order a Parking Place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class the Driver of a Vehicle shall not, except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council, permit that Vehicle to wait in that Parking Place unless it is of the class specified.
12. (1) Where the position in which a Vehicle may wait in a Parking Place is specified in the Schedule to this Order the Driver of a Vehicle shall not, except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council, permit that Vehicle to wait in that Parking Place in a position other than that specified.

(2) Where within a Parking Place there is a surface marking in the form of Double Yellow Lines the Driver of a Vehicle shall not permit that Vehicle to wait in that part of the Parking Place, except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council.
13. Where in the Schedule to this Order a Parking Place is described as available for vehicles displaying a valid Permit, the Driver of a Vehicle shall not, except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council, permit that vehicle to wait in that Parking Place unless it displays a valid Permit as may be applicable.
14. Where within a Parking Place there is a Sign or Marked Bay which indicates that a Parking Space is available only for a Disabled Person's Vehicle the Driver of a Vehicle shall not permit that Vehicle to wait in that Parking Space unless it is a Disabled Person's Vehicle lawfully displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in the appropriate position.
15. Where within a Parking Place there is a Sign or Marked bay which indicates that a Parking Space is available only for a Vehicle of a Reserved Parking Bay the Driver of a Vehicle shall not permit that Vehicle to wait in that Parking Space unless that Permit is displayed on the Vehicle in the appropriate position.
16. Where within a Parking Place there is a Sign or Marked Bay which indicates that a Parking Space is available only for the Vehicle of a Permit holder the Driver of a Vehicle shall not permit that Vehicle to wait in that Parking Space unless that Permit is displayed in the appropriate position.

17. (1) The Driver of a Vehicle using a Parking Place specified in Schedule 2 to this Order shall on leaving the Vehicle in that Parking Place pay the appropriate Parking Charge in accordance with the Scale of Charges specified in column 7 of the said Schedule.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that nothing in this paragraph shall apply in respect of any Vehicle which is waiting in a Parking Place and is displaying in the relevant position a Season Ticket valid in respect of that Vehicle and in respect of the Parking Space in which that Vehicle is parked.

- (2) The Parking Charge shall be payable either

- (a) by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins into the Ticket Machine or Pay Station provided, or
- (b) through the Pay by Phone system, or
- (c) by credit or debit card, or
- (d) to the Civil Enforcement Officer, being a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to receive such charge.

- (3) No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait during the Chargeable Hours in a charged Parking Place for longer than the parking period paid for on payment of the Parking Charge

- (4) The Owner of a Vehicle may on application to the Council purchase a Season Ticket in respect of that Vehicle for a charge ascertained by reference to the Scale of Charges in Schedule 3 to this Order and that Season Ticket shall be valid in such Parking Places as are specified thereon during the period for which it is issued.

- (5) Any ticket issued on payment of the charge referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article and any Season Ticket issued in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article shall be displayed in the relevant position on or in the Vehicle in respect of which it was issued.

18. The Driver of a Vehicle shall not, except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council, permit that Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place for longer than the maximum period permitted in the Schedules for waiting in relation to that Parking Place.

19. The following vehicles left in a Parking Place shall be exempt from the payment of any charge specified in column 7 of Schedule 2 to this Order and from any limitation on time specified in column 5 of the said Schedule

- (a) an Invalid Carriage;
- (b) a Vehicle issued to a disabled person by the Department of Health and Social Security in lieu of an Invalid Carriage;
- (d) a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in a relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge or Parking Disc.

20. (1) An contravention is committed and a Penalty Charge incurred if a Vehicle is left in a Parking Place -

- (a) for longer than the period for which payment has been made in accordance with column 7 of Schedule 2 to this Order; or
- (b) contrary to the classes of Vehicle permitted to park; or
- (c) for longer than the period for which vehicles may wait; or
- (d) without displaying a valid Permit; or

(e) in a position reserved for either a Disabled Person's Vehicle or Vehicle with a Permit of the Council; that Vehicle not being appropriately a Disabled Person's Vehicle or Vehicle with a valid Permit of the Council; or

(f) in a position so as to obstruct access to the Parking Place or to any premises adjoining the Parking Place or to obstruct an access way within the Parking Place.

21. (1) Where, in the case of a stationary Vehicle, a Civil Enforcement Officer has reason to believe that a Penalty Charge is payable with respect to the Vehicle, he may-

(a) fix a Penalty Charge Notice to the Vehicle; or

(b) give such a notice to the person appearing to him to be in charge of the Vehicle.

(2) In the case of a Vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge may have been incurred it shall be the duty of the Civil Enforcement Officer to attach to the Vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:

(a) Vehicle registration number;

(b) Make of Vehicle;

(c) Colour of Vehicle;

(d) Detailed location of Vehicle (for example meter number, name of car park, or other description of Parking Place)

(e) Contravention code and description of contravention;

(f) Time of issue;

(g) Date of contravention and date of issue;

(h) Penalty Charge Notice number;

(i) Civil Enforcement Officer's number

(j) Civil Enforcement Officer's signature

(3) A Penalty Charge Notice must also state -

(a) the grounds on which the parking attendant believes that a Penalty Charge is payable with respect to the Vehicle;

(b) the amount of the Penalty Charge which is payable;

(c) that the Penalty Charge must be paid before the end of the period of 28 days beginning with the date of the notice;

(d) that if the Penalty Charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the notice, the amount of the Penalty Charge will be reduced by one half

(e) that, if the Penalty Charge is not paid before the end of the 28 day period, a Notice to Owner may be served by the Parking Authority on the person appearing to them to be the Owner of the Vehicle;

(f) the address to which payment of the Penalty Charge must be sent.

(4) Provided that the requirements of this paragraph shall not apply to a breach of this Order if the Vehicle is removed from the Parking Place before the notice can be completed and affixed to the Vehicle and that such Penalty Charge Notice may be challenged by the Registered Keeper through an independent appeals tribunal managed by the Traffic Penalty Tribunal or its successor in title by a Parking Adjudicator.

(5) If the Penalty Charge is not paid after a minimum of 56 days and a Charge Certificate is issued, the Penalty Charge payable will be increased to an amount recommended by the Secretary of State for the time being and approved by the Council.

22. If at any time while a Vehicle is left in a Parking Place a ticket is attached to the Vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 17 (5) of this Order and the time shown on the clock of any apparatus or device or by the Civil Enforcement Officer referred to in Article 17 (2) of this Order indicates that the period for which the Vehicle may be parked as represented by such ticket has expired, it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that such period has expired.

23. The Council may, by Notice or by Order, suspend the use of any Parking Place or any part thereof subject to such conditions or exceptions as they consider necessary.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that any person suspending the use of a Parking Place in accordance with the provisions of this Article shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that Parking Place or the part thereof the use of which is suspended such Signs as are necessary to indicate that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.

24. (1) When a Vehicle is left in a Parking Place in contravention of or non-compliance with any of the provisions of this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the Vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that Parking Place.

(2) In case of an emergency a police constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter the position of that Vehicle in the Parking Place; or remove the Vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that Parking Place to any place he thinks fit.

25. Any person altering the position of a Vehicle in, or removing a Vehicle from, a Parking Place by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the Vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the Vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.

26. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a Vehicle from a Parking Place by virtue of Article 19 of this Order he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the Vehicle

27. The Driver of a Vehicle shall not use a Parking Place

(a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining a road or the use of a road by other persons or so as to be a nuisance;

(b) when such Parking Place has been closed in accordance with the provisions of the preceding Article of this Order.

28. The Driver of a Vehicle using a Parking Place shall stop the engine as soon as the Vehicle is in position in the Parking Place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the Vehicle in or to depart from the Parking Place.

29. No person shall

(a) sell, offer or exhibit for sale or hire any Vehicle while it is in a Parking Place, or

(b) use a Vehicle, while it is in a Parking Place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the Parking Place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skills in handicraft or services in any capacity.

30. The Driver of a Vehicle using a Parking Place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the Vehicle in or to depart from the Parking Place
31. No person shall except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council, drive any Vehicle in a Parking Place other than for the purpose of leaving that Vehicle in the Parking Place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the Parking Place.
32. No person shall in a Parking Place want only shout or otherwise make or cause to be made any loud noise to the disturbance or annoyance of users of the Parking Place or residents of premises in the neighbourhood.
33. No person shall in a Parking Place use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned.
34. No person shall in a Parking Place play or take part in any game.
35. No person shall use any part of a Parking Place or any vehicle left in a Parking Place:-
- (a) for sleeping or camping purposes;
 - (b) for eating or cooking purposes;
 - (c) for the purpose of servicing or washing any Vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable the Vehicle to depart from the Parking Place; or
 - (d) for the purpose of washing any part of his person.
36. No person shall in any Parking Place without the consent of the Council distribute or affix to any Vehicle left in the Parking Place any literature or leaflets of any nature.
37. No person shall use a Parking Place as a means of passage proceeding from one road to another road.
38. No person shall in a Parking Place without the consent of the Council distribute or affix to any vehicle left in the Parking Place any literature or leaflets of any nature.
39. Where in a Parking Place signs are erected or markings are laid for the purpose of -
- (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the Parking Place; or
 - (b) indicating that a Vehicle using the Parking Place shall proceed in a specified direction within the Parking Place
- no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any Vehicle (i) so that it entered the Parking Place otherwise than by an entrance, or leaves the Parking Place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated or (ii) in a direction other than that specified, as the case may be.
40. In a Parking Place no person shall:-
- (a) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written consent of the Council; or
 - (b) light or cause or permit to be lit any fire
41. No trailer shall use a Parking Place, unless otherwise stated.
42. No Minibus or Motor Caravan shall use a Parking Place unless otherwise stated.

43. Electric or Hybrid Vehicles can only use the Electric Charging Point and specified Parking Bays located within a Parking Place when the Vehicle is being charged and is limited to 3 hours charging period with no return for 3 hours.
44. Electric or Hybrid Vehicles can only use the Electric Charging Point and Specified Parking Bays located within a Parking Place when the Vehicle is being Charged and is limited to 1 hour charging period with no return for 1 hour and pay and display charges apply
45. Vehicles using a Parent and Child Parking Bay within a Parking Place must have a valid Parking Ticket or valid Pay by Phone session (a Permit is not permitted).
46. The Head of Service or Authorised Person of the Council may vary the conditions of a Parking Place or places as expedient for good management of the Parking Place or places accordingly.
47. Where road names or property names have been changed following reclassification, renaming or renumbering, the descriptive names within this order may be changed without changing the effect of the Order.
48. Where parts of this Order (and any subsequent Amendment Orders) have been mis-quoted, mis-transposed, omitted or are subject to typographical errors during the compilation process, the text of the Order may be amended without changing the effect of the Order and without the need for re-advertisement.


