Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of its power under sections 1(1), 2 (1) to (3), 3 (2), 4 (1) and (2), 32 (1), 35 (1), 44, 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following order:-

Due to the concerns of damage to the road and to walls near the road and for preserving and to improve amenities of the area which the road runs, Kent County Council has made the decision to implement waiting restrictions on College Road, Margate following the Experimental Order that has been in place since January 2020.

Roads in Margate in the District of Thanet

COLLEGE ROAD - On the north-western side from a point opposite the boundary of 15/17 College Road to a point opposite the boundary of 23/25 College Road.

The Order was made on 15 October 2020 and its provisions will come into effect on 19 October 2020.

A copy of the Order, statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, a map indicating the location and the effect and a copy of any Orders which will be amended by the Order may be examined on Monday to Friday at The Kent County Council, Sessions House, Maidstone, ME14 1XQ; The Kent County Council, Highway, Transportation & Waste, Ashford Highway Depot, Henwood Industrial Estate, Unit 4 Javelin Way, Ashford, Kent TN24 8AD during normal office hours or viewed online at www.kent.gov.uk/highwaysconsultations

Anyone may, by application to the High Court within 6 weeks of the date of publication of this Notice, challenge the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in them on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or any instrument made thereunder, or that there has been a failure to comply with any statutory requirement to the Orders.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The Kent County Council, acting as the Local Traffic Authority and in exercise of its powers and under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 44, 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act') and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

"The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Thanet) (Waiting Restrictions and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2019" ('the Order of 2019') shall have effect as though:

In the Schedules to the Order of 2019

Roads in Margate in the District of Thanet

The following to be inserted in the First Schedule of the Order of 2019 in place of the existing entries—

COLLEGE ROAD

- (1) On both sides between points 13 metres east of the eastern building line of 247 College Road and the junction with Dane Valley Road.
- (2) On the south-eastern side
- (a) from the junction with Nash Road to a point in line with the boundary of 3/4 Empire Terrace;
- (b) between points in line with the boundary of 31/33 College Road and 15 metres north-east of the junction with St Peters Footpath;
- (3) On the north-western side
- (a) from the junction with Tivoli Road to a point opposite the boundary of 3/4 Empire Terrace;
- (b) from a point opposite the boundary of 15/17 College Road to a point opposite the boundary of 23/25 College Road;
- (c) from a point opposite the boundary of 31/33 College Road to a point 125 metres east of the eastern kerbline of Ramsgate Road:
- (d) between points 10 metres south-west and 10 metres northeast of the junction with Ulster Road;

- (e) from a point 20 metres north-east of the boundary of 38/40 College Road to a point opposite the western building line of College Road Clinic;
- (f) between points 15 metres south-west and 15 metres northeast of the junction with Old School Gardens;
- (g) between points 10 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerbline of Durban Road and a point 13 metres south-west of the south-western kerbline of St Peters Footpath.
- (4) On the northern side from a point 10 metres east and 10 metres west of the junction with Glencoe Road.

This Order may be cited as "The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Thanet) (Waiting Restrictions and Street Parking Places) (Amendment No.7) Order 2020" ('this Order') and shall come into force on 19th day of October 2020.
